Expand the Physician Workforce

Iowa faces a physician shortage crisis, ranking 44th in the nation for physicians per capita. This means longer patient wait times, greater workloads, and higher physician burnout. Governor Reynolds proposed a robust plan to bolster the physician workforce by:



Increasing the number of residency slots at Iowa teaching hospitals by 115 per year.




Streamlining and increasing funding for health care loan repayment programs to support high demand specialties and practice locations for individuals who commit to practice in Iowa.

Support Governor Reynold's health care workforce package to bolster the physician workforce.



Reform Prior Authorization

Prior Authorization is the requirement that physicians obtain pre-approval from a health insurance carrier before the patient receives coverage for a medical treatment.



This practice is an administrative burden that:

- Prevents patients from receiving care. Physicians spend approximately 45 minutes on paperwork for every 30 minutes of patient care.
- Contributes to burnout, causing physicians to exit the workforce.
- Causes care delays, treatment abandonment, increased costs, and adverse health events.
